

HIGHLAND ROAD BIKE/PEDESTRIAN PATH PROJECT

CONNECTING ROTARY PARK TO THE INTERURBAN TRAIL & THE TOWN CENTERS OF MEQUON AND THIENSVILLE

WHY CREATE THE PATH AND WHO BENEFITS?

Rotary Park in Mequon is loved for the multiple recreation uses (bicycling, walking, running, competitive sport activities, entertainment, etc.) This path will enhance the accessibility of the Park while providing connectivity to the Interurban Trail.

Safety

Currently residents along the 1.5 miles of proposed path along Highland Road have no safe access by bicycle or foot from Rotary Park to the Interurban Trail.

14 Mile Trail Accessibility

The Highland Road Bike Path will resolve these safety issues and enhance the Mequon Community. It will also make the 14 mile Interurban Trail accessible for residents.

MCF Grants \$9,000 for the Fire Department

THREE ZOLL AUTOPULSE DEVICES, SECURED BY MCF GRANTS, STAND READY FOR USE BY A CITY OF MEQUON AMBULANCE.

The Mequon Community Foundation granted \$9,000 for the purchase of 3 refurbished Auto Pulse devices to the Mequon Fire Department in 2020.

When a medically related request for service is made to Mequon Fire, no matter the severity of that call, a mechanical CPR Device, known as a Zoll AutoPulse, will be at the scene and available if needed.

Deputy Fire Chief Kurt Zellmann explains:

"These devices change the dynamic of a Cardiac Arrest call once they are deployed and compressing. The devices free up EMS providers from

the grueling task of providing effective chest compressions and instead allow the EMS providers to focus on the treatments and reversible causes of cardiac arrest. When an AutoPulse is on a patient and compressing, it eliminates one of the most stressful portions of a cardiac arrest call.

The device works continuously, and the rescue worker does not have to worry about fatigue, consequently providing ineffective compressions.

While it's not a miracle cure by any means, we know that by having these devices, the patient is receiving the best possible chest compression for the entire duration of the event. And we are giving them the best possible chance we can to restart the heart".



MEQUON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION MAKES GRANTS TO SUPPORT K9'S



K9 OFFICER IRON

K9 Officer Iron is a male German Shepherd imported to the United States from Werther, Germany. K9 Officer Iron was born on 11/01/2012 and has been with the City of Mequon Police Department and his handler, Sergeant Jacob Schiller, since the fall of 2014.

MCF K9 donations at work!

The Mequon Police Department has found the K9 Unit invaluable in assisting other MPD officers perform their duties.

K9 Officer Iron will age out of his duties in the next two years. Planning ahead, MPD approached MCF in 2019 to run a campaign in order to raise funds for a new transitional K9. The Foundation and community responded with over \$150,000 raised for the new K9. The young Officer Djuke (pronounced "Duke") came to Mequon in 2020. K9 Officers Iron and Djuke are both trained and certified in tracking, narcotics detection, handler protection, apprehension, and building/area searches. They were trained at the Steinig Tal Kennel in Campbellsport, WI.

To date, MCF has granted \$83,000 for the purchase of Djuke, the related vehicle and supplies, and training/costs for the handler. The remaining funds are held by MCF in a fund restricted for the sole purpose of MPD's K9 Unit. Training and other costs are ongoing with the K9 Unit, thus the responsible fund-raising goal needed to cover more than just the purchase of the dog.

K9 Officer Iron and K9 Officer Djuke reside with their handlers at their residences when they are off duty and are considered part of the family.



K9 OFFICER DJUKE

K9 Officer Djuke is a male German Shepherd imported to the United States from Grabow, Germany. Born on 03/24/2019, K9 Officer Djuke has been with the City of Mequon Police Department and his Handler, Officer Bottoni, since the fall of 2020.

The Mequon Community Foundation advocated for the Mequon Police Department and K9 Unit at Gathering on the Green in July 2021 and successfully raised \$8,000 for the police department. This enabled the police department to purchase two Bulls Sturmvogel Evo Street e-bikes outfitted for bike patrol that can be used throughout the city. MCF representatives, K9 Officers Djuke and Iron, as well as other uniformed officers were present to answer question and interact with the community. The response from the community was overwhelming.

The Mequon Community Foundation (MCF) is proud to have partnered with the Mequon Fire Department at the Taste of Mequon on September 11th.

Our partnership raised \$3,209 for defibrillators, laryngoscopes, and operational supplies for the Departments' mechanical CPR devices. All of these devices have proven to be extremely valuable in providing effective and cutting edge care for patients as well as increasing the rate of procedural success in critical situations. The tent was manned throughout the day by

the Fire Department and MCF board members and friends to provide a 'meet and greet' with first responders and had 7 lucky winners to receive a ride in a fire truck to school. Per Deputy Chief Kurt Zellman, "Thank you for giving me the opportunity to have an audience with so many people in our community to share what the Mequon Community Foundation has done to benefit MFD!"

MEQUON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION MAKES GRANTS TO SUPPORT COMMUNITY

In 2020, MCF granted \$3,500 to the Ozaukee Youth Hockey Association.

This is a new grantee recipient for MCF and aligns well with our mission. OYHA provides a bountiful youth hockey program, adult leagues geared towards all females and older adults, a robust learn to skate program, and year round figure skating options, enrichment skating programs for families, and a state of the art fitness facility. They serve over 473,000 people annually and provide extracurricular enjoyment, team building and family bonding. Unlike many other ice rinks, the Ozaukee Ice Center receives no government funding and relies on foundations and individuals to provide these services.


